Wilson County Household Hazardous and Electronic Waste Collection Event

Wilson County in cooperation with the Alamo Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) Area, Inc. is pleased to bring to the residents of Wilson County an opportunity to safely dispose of any household hazardous waste materials and electronics (E-Waste) for FREE. A Household Hazardous and Electronic Waste Collection station will be set up at the Poth City Park, 801 Coy St., in Poth, and materials will be received from 8:00 a.m. to 11 a.m. (or until the site has collected its limit) on Sat., Sept. 25, 2010.

Trained personnel and volunteers will be on hand to collect and package materials for safe transport and disposal at an approved disposal site. Individuals dropping off material must show their current drivers license to prove they reside in Wilson County. The event will be on a first-come, first-served basis. The collection will close at the discretion of the sponsors. No businesses will be allowed.
