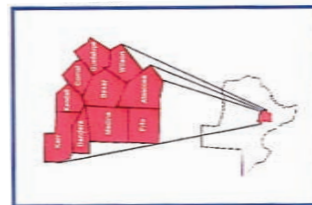

WHAT IS THE ALAMO RC&D AREA?

Alamo RC&D Area Inc., is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization created in support of the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) RC&D program. RC&D is a unique program, led by local volunteer councils, that helps people care for and protect natural resources in a way that improves the local economy, environment, and living standards. We serve ten counties in the central- and south-Texas area.

HOW ARE WE ORGANIZED?

Our board comprises one representative from each county we serve, plus a representative of the Alamo Area Council of Governments and four at-large directors. All are volunteers except our Board Coordinator, who is a paid employee of the NRCS.

WHAT IS OUR HISTORY?

Throughout the nation, more than 375 RC&D programs — which are located in every state — have been helping community outreach programs achieve their goals for more than thirty years.
